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THE STORY



or thousands of years the two kingdoms ruled by Queen Xina and King Bodd have competed fiercely to be the first to conquer the labyrinth in the bowels of Mount Foliandre. According to legend the goblin who manages to come through all the tests in the Labyrinth of Foliandre will win eternal benefit for his people.

So far, all those who have tried their luck have returned completely insane, and a river of bitterness continues to flow from the Mountain through the two hostile kingdoms.

For many years this ancestral struggle has captivated the attention of the greatest historians and especially the readers of *Goblins News*. Blount, one of the most talented journalists of the newspaper, has dreamed of obtaining a sensational scoop for a long time. But recently there have been new and alarming developments. Behorn, the guardian of the Labyrinth and the only person who can guarantee that the tests have been passed fairly, has just died of old age. This is bad news, plus the disturbing discovery that the key to the entrance has disappeared! Even more serious, Behorn's daughter, Wynonna, cannot be found!

Has Wynonna been kidnapped? Is she is in danger? Without the key, how can the champions try to overcome the obstacles of the Labyrinth? Has one of the monarchs stolen the key to be able to explore the Labyrinth, despite what the rules say?

Blount wants to find the answers to these questions. He has made up his mind. He will go to the two kingdoms and interview the two rivals. While he's there he'll try to draw their portraits since nobody has any idea what the two hostile monarchs look like.



THE JOURNEY

B lount starts out by boarding a flying vessel, for Mount Foliandre is in a very remote region. But when he leaves his cabin the following day he finds that the captain, the crew and even the rats have abandoned the vessel which is now being bombarded by huge rocks. Great holes have already appeared in the hull and the nose is slowly but surely submerging. Blount must get off this ship before it capsizes completely.



This is only the beginning of a long series of hair-raising adventures for Blount. Very soon he finds Wynonna being mistreated by King Bodd's henchmen, and he immediately intervenes. As

a result he comes up against a fierce wolf who leaves him for dead **and** possessed of a Werewolf personality which reveals itself any time he is exposed to the Moon!



Blount has to find a means of transport and then concoct weird potions in the laboratory of an alchemist, potions such as the speedixir or growthixir which will enable him to reach the kingdoms of Xina and Bodd. He is late for the story!

Thanks to his double personality, he might have a chance to try and overcome the obstacles of the labyrinth and become the champion of both Xina and Bodd. Maybe he will also be able to resolve the conflict that divides the two kingdoms.



THE AIM OF THE GAME

Solution to the castles of both King Bodd and Queen Xina. His adventures take him through small worlds made up of two or three connected scenes. Each world contains an enigma. The pieces of the solution to the puzzle are scattered about in the different scenes that make up the world.

Blount sets out on his own, but he meets other characters in the course of the game. These include Chump the parrot, Fulbert the boaconstrictor and Ooya the sage. Though you





can select them and make them move like Blount, they will not pick up objects and their actions are few and selective. Blount can only succeed by combining his actions with those of the characters who accompany him.

For example: while Fulbert swings the candelabra, Blount can hold on to it. In this case timing is all important. To succeed, you must make your move exactly right, neither too early nor too late.



INTERACTIVITY

When Blount and one of his companions are on the screen at the same time, they can be manipulated simultaneously. But the orders must be given alternately by activating one character at a time. When activated the character you select is seen in profile on the screen. To change to another character click the left-hand mouse button on him.

THE SCREEN

THE SCREEN IS DIVIDED INTO FOUR AREAS:

The Control Panel which appears on the top of the screen when the arrow cursor touches the first three lines of the screen.

The Central Part where the action takes place. The action is seen by scrolling through more than one screen.

The Dialog Window.

The Command Line, or the last line of the screen.

THE CURSOR'S ROLE

When you move the cursor <<arrow>> over the screen it corresponds to your investigation. Text appears on the command line when you move into a special zone. This allows you to find:

Special places or objects.

Characters. You can show them objects, give them objects or allow them to express themselves.

Exit. The cursor <<arrow>> changes into a door.

Following are places and results when you click the cursor <<arrow>>:

On the ground. The goblin goes to the chosen place. On an active zone. The goblin moves up to the place indicated and carries out the corresponding action. For example, click the cursor on a button and he presses it.

On an object. The goblin moves toward the object and picks it up. This will cause the <<object>> cursor (a barred arrow) to appear. This means that you are holding the object. The phrase <<**USE (name of object) ON>>** appears on the command line. The object can be put to immediate use or placed in the inventory.

THE CONTROL PANEL



To call up the control panel move the cursor to the top of the screen. An Icon Bar with six icons will appear. Choose a function by clicking on the icon with the left mouse button.

1. Game Management. A menu including:

<<SAVE>>, <<RESTORE>>, <<QUIT>>.

Save. There are positions for saving your place in the game onto the hard disk. Select a line, write the name of your save game.

Restore. Each of the positions can be restored. The game will be as you left it.

Quit. Allows you to leave the game.

- 2. Jokers. You have five jokers available for the game. These give you extra clues if you get really stuck.
- Goblins News. The cover page of each edition gives a summary of the hero's current achievements in his guest. It may be consulted in each scene.
- Inventory. Another way of gaining access to the inventory, other than right clicking the mouse.
- Current Goal. A map indicating the local puzzle and your precise actual location.

6. Options.

Music. This allows you to turn the sound track on or off. The symbol ">" indicates that the "music on" option was chosen.

Info. Gives you the date, the hour and the time spent on the game.



SOME ADVICE

•When you get to a new screen, start by picking out the important zones and objects.

• Don't spend too much time in a single scene. Explore the nearby scenes to find clues.

•Click on the same character several times. He can say different things each time.

•There is no need to wait for a character to finish his action before activating the next action.

•There are no stalemate situations; the key objects are unlimited. As the characters cannot die, you just have to start the action again if an action or series of actions fails.

•Don't forget to try each character on each zone. They don't always react in the same way, and can give you different results.

•Use the objects often on the zones, even in the most farfetched combinations, and on each of the characters. Don't forget that they like joking!

START UP PROCEDURE

IBM PC and compatibles with a hard disk

Insert 'DISK 1' in Disk Drive (e.g., A: or B:).

Type A: (or B:) and press ENTER.

Type INSTALL and press ENTER. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Default directory will be GOB3 (C:sierra\GOB3). Once the game has been installed, change directory (type CD) to the directory where you installed the game (e.g., CD\SIERRA\GOB3).

Type GO and press ENTER

To bypass the Introduction and Credits, press the **ESC** key when they appear on the screen. NOTE: If at a later point you wish to change the configuration of your sound device, reload the game by typing **SETUP** at the DOS prompt, then press **ENTER**.

If you have changed the jumper settings on your sound card, 'Advanced Configuration' allows you to configure the game to the non-standard setting.

CD ROM

Insert the CD into your CD drive.

Change drive to your CD drive (e.g., D:)

Type INSTALL and follow the instructions on the screen.

To start the game, go to the hard disk directory where the game has been stored, type GO and then press ENTER. After installation is complete type GO and press ENTER.

TIPS FOR ADVENTURERS

EXPLORE each area of the game very carefully, and DRAW A MAP as you progress through the game. Make a note of each area you visit, and include information about objects found there.

BE CAREFUL, and remain alert at all times — danger may lurk in the most unlikely of places!

DON'T GET DISCOURAGED. If you come to an obstacle that seems insurmountable, don't despair. Every problem in the game has at least one solution, and some may have more than one. If all else fails, click on the Joker in the icon bar for some hints.

BRING ALONG SOME HELP. You may find it helpful (and fun) to play the game with a friend. Two (or more) heads are better than one at Interpreting clues and solving problems.

TECHNICAL HELP

(MS-DOS ONLY)

You may receive one or more of the following messages when playing your Sierra game or during installation. The following paragraphs show the possible error messages in bold with explanations and solutions detailed afterwards.

CRC ERROR: This message means you have a bad disk. It stands for Cyclic Redundancy Check, a way to check for disk errors.

DATA ERROR READING DRIVE A or B: This message means you have a bad disk. See "The Sierra No Risk Guarantee" on page 22 for information on disk replacement.

GENERAL FAILURE READING DRIVE A or B: This message means you probably have a low density floppy drive and are trying to read incompatible high density disks.

YOU NEED "_____ " MORE BYTES OF FREE MEMORY AVAILABLE TO RUN THIS GAME: This message means that there is not enough free memory to successfully run the program. You may need to boot your system with a Boot Disk. See BOOT DISK INSTRUCTIONS on the following pages.

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SECTOR NOT FOUND READING DRIVE A: (While reading any MS-DOS game disk) This message means you have a bad disk. See "The Sierra No Risk Guarantee" on page 22 for information on disk replacement.

MEMORY REQUIREMENTS

Sierra's programs require a large amount of memory (RAM) in order to function properly. If you are encountering difficulties and want to see how much memory is available through DOS, type CHKDSK [ENTER]. (DOS 5.0 users may type MEM.) An example of a typical system is:

655,360 Bytes Total Memory (640K)

597,842 Bytes Free (584K)

If the "Bytes Free" line is below 563,200 (550K), please use a boot disk.

BOOT DISK INSTRUCTIONS

Booting your computer system with a Boot Disk before you play your Sierra game will keep any TSR (Terminate-and-Stay-Resident) programs from being loaded into memory.

CREATING A BOOT DISK

PLEASE NOTE: The format command must be used with care to avoid erasing all stored information on your hard disk. Please follow the instructions on the following pages exactly.

Formatting From A Hard Disk

1. Insert a blank disk into Drive A:.

2. At the C: prompt, type: format a:/s [ENTER]

Note: If your A: drive is a 3.5" high density drive, using a low density disk, type: format a:/s/t:80/n:9 [ENTER]

Note: If your A: drive is a 5.25" high density drive, using a low density disk, type: format a:/s/t:40/n:9 [ENTER]

3. Follow the DOS prompts.

Formatting From A Diskette Drive

1. Insert your original MS-DOS system disk in Drive A:.

2. At the A: prompt, type: format a:/s [ENTER]

3. When prompted, insert a blank disk into Drive A: and follow the DOS prompts.

NOTE: Goblins 3 must be played with a mouse. Please refer to the mouse driver section prior to making the Boot Disk.

MS-DOS 5.0 & ABOVE USERS

Now you need to create a CONFIG.SYS file for your boot disk. CREATING A CONFIG.SYS FILE FOR 386 OR 486 COMPUTERS

1. Insert your formatted blank disk into Drive A:.

2. Type: a: [ENTER]

3. Type: copy con config.sys [ENTER]

4. Type: device=c:\dos\himem.sys [ENTER]

5. Type: device=c:\dos\emm386.exe ram [ENTER]

6. Type: files=30 [ENTER]

7. Type: buffers=30 [ENTER]

8. Type: stacks=0.0 [ENTER]

9. Type: dos=high,umb [ENTER]

10. Press the [F6] key, then press [ENTER].

You should see the message: . 1 File(s) copied.

Now you need to create an AUTOEXEC.BAT file for your boot disk.

CREATING AN AUTOEXEC.BAT FILE FOR 386 OR 486 COMPUTERS

1. Type: copy con autoexec.bat [ENTER]

2. Type: prompt \$p\$g [ENTER]

3. Type: path=c:\dos [ENTER]

4. Press the [F6] key, then press [ENTER].

You should see the message: 1 File(s) copied.

MOUSE DRIVERS

A mouse is required to play this Sierra game. In order to activate your mouse when using a boot disk, you must copy your mouse driver onto your Boot Disk. The following are examples of statements that are required to be added to either the CONFIG.SYS or AUTOEXEC.BAT for the automatic loading of the mouse driver.

THE CONFIG.SYS FILE:

(If MOUSE.SYS was copied to the Boot Disk)

Devicehigh=Mouse.sys

THE AUTOEXEC.BAT FILE TYPE:

(If MOUSE.COM was copied to the Boot Disk)

Ih mouse

IMPORTANTI After you have created a Boot Disk, you must REBOOT your computer with the disk. Leaving the boot disk in Drive A:, press [Ctrl]-[Ah]-[Del] at the same time. Your computer will now reboot, with a: as the default drive. Type c: [ENTER] to change back to your hard disk. Then type cd sierra\GOB3 [ENTER] to change to the Goblins directory. Follow the instructions in the manual to start the game, and have a great time!

Boot Disk instructions for other DOS formats are also available for downloading from the Sierra BBS (209-683-4463). Download the file BDAILEXE for a complete listing of the instructions commonly requested most.

If you have created a Boot Disk and booted your system with it before playing your Sierra game, and your problem is still evident, something else may be wrong. Following are some trouble-shooting tips that Sierra's Technical Support Department recommends.

QUICK TROUBLE-SHOOTING TIPS

1. Boot your system with the Boot Disk you created.

2. Reinstall the game under a Boot Disk environment.

3. If you are experiencing any form of program hesitation or lockups during game play and are using a Sound Blaster or compatible sound card, the following information is a temporary solution to have you up and running quickly. Run the Setup Utility and use the advanced configuration option for the sound card or select AdLib for sound. For correct sound card functionality, a call to Sierra On-Line's Technical Support or your sound card manufacturer's Technical Support is recommended.

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
